Students

Safety

The Board of Education places a high responsibility on safety and the prevention of student injury. Principals and staff are responsible for the conduct and safety of students from the time they come under school supervision until they leave school supervision, whether or not they are on school premises.

Although the District is not liable for the safety of students who are not under school supervision, the school District can, and does, hold students accountable for their behavior from the time they leave their homes for school, until they return to their homes from school, on the playgrounds and during recess, and while they are on school premises and/or under supervision of school District personnel. (E.C. 44807, 44808) (cf. 5144 - Discipline)

The Superintendent or designee shall establish regulations and procedures as necessary to protect students from dangerous situations. (cf. 3514 - Environmental Safety) (cf. 3515 - School Safety and Security) (cf. 3515.2 - Intruders on Campus) (cf. 5131.1 - Bus Conduct) (cf. 5141 - Health Care and Emergencies) (cf. 5141.1 - Accidents) (cf. 5144 - Discipline) (cf. 6114 - Emergencies and Disaster Preparedness Plan) (cf. 6145.2 - Interscholastic Competition) (cf. 6161.3 - Toxic Supplies)

A minor student shall not be permitted to leave school in the custody of a person other than the student's legal parent/guardian unless that person has the verified authorization of the legal parent(s)/guardian(s) or as specified for emergency release at the time of disaster. Properly authorized law officers may seize or apprehend according to law. (cf. 5145.11 - Questioning and Apprehension)

It is the responsibility of the principal or designee to provide for adequate supervision of playgrounds and other school facilities at all times they are in use by students during the school day or at school-sponsored activities. The principal or designee shall establish playground and school ground safety rules designed to develop good citizenship and prevent accidents. (cf. 6143 - Courses of Study)

The principal shall make full use of the cooperative services of local and county organizations which provide safety services, such as fire, law enforcement and disaster preparedness agencies. (cf. 6114.1 - Fire Drills and Fires)
