Students

Refusal to Harm or Destroy Animals

The Board of Education recognizes that some students have a moral objection to dissecting or otherwise harming or destroying animals. California law grants these students the right to refrain from participation in instruction which involves such activities.

Students shall not be discriminated against because of a decision to exercise this right. (E.C. 32255.1)

The Board encourages staff to accommodate students who request alternative educational projects in lieu of those which entail harm or destruction of animals.

At the beginning of each academic year, the District shall notify students and parents or guardians of the students' right to refrain from instruction involving harm or destruction of animals. (Education Code 48980) Such notification shall also be given to students by each teacher of a course that uses live or dead animals or animal parts. (E.C. 32255.4) (cf. 5145.6 - Notifications Required by Law)

Agricultural education classes are exempt from the legal provisions which allow students this right. (E.C. 32255.6)
