The CA ELD Standards are not intended to replace the CCSS for ELA, but instead to amplify the language knowledge, skills and abilities of those CCSS that are critical in order for ELs to simultaneously be successful in school while they are developing English.

PART I – Ensure students interact in meaningful ways (engage in dialogue with others, comprehend and analyze written and spoken texts, create oral presentations and written texts).

PART II – Increase student understanding of how English works (building understanding of how language resources and text structure contribute to a text, use nouns and verbs and additional details to expand and enrich ideas, use a variety of language resources to connect and condense ideas within sentences).

Part III - Consider particular background characteristics of EL students when designing, teaching, and monitoring foundational literacy skills.

Students in grades 6-12 apply the Reading Standards to the following range of text types, with texts selected from a broad range of cultures and periods.
