# NCAA Division II Requirements 

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## What is NCAA Division II?

- One of 3 divisions (I, II and III)
- Emphasize a life balance in which academically and athletically gifted students can compete at a high level, while maintaining a traditional collegiate experience (Guide for the College Bound Student-Athlete).
- An institution will have 10 sports minimum (minimum of 4 men's sports and 5 women's sports)
- An institution must provide minimum of $\$ 250,000$ in athletics aid (at least half for women)


## Recruiting

- Recruitment activities can't begin until June $15^{\text {th }}$ before a prospective student-athlete's junior year.
- Printed recruiting material
- Phone calls, emails or texts from coaches
- Off-campus contact with coach and the prospective student-athlete or parent/ legal guardian
- Official visit (expense paid)
- Tryouts


## Division II Initial Eligibility

- Academic and amateurism certification process
- Academic (Before August 2018):
- Graduate from high school
- 16 core courses from different subject areas
- 2.0 cumulative GPA in core courses
- Combined SAT score of 820 (critical reading and math) OR combined ACT sum score of 68 (English, Reading, Math and Science)


## Division II Initial Eligibility

- QUALIFIER=Meeting all outlined requirements
- You can do the following during the first year of enrollment:
- Practice
- Compete
- Receive athletics aid
- PARTIAL QUALIFIER= graduated HS and meet one of the following:

1) $820 \mathrm{SAT} / 68 \mathrm{ACT}$ or 2 ) 16 core courses with a 2.0 GPA

- You can do the following during the first year of enrollment:
- Practice
- Receive Athletics Aid
- May not compete in your first year of enrollment


## Division II Initial Eligibility

- NON-QUALIFIER= didn't meet qualifier or partial qualifier requirements
- You are not permitted the following during the first year of enrollment:
- Practice
- Compete
- Receive athletics aid
- Observe practice


## 16 Core-Courses

- 3 years of English
- 2 years of Math (Algebra 1 or higher)
- 2 years of Natural or Physical Science (one year of Iab science)
- 3 additional years of English, Math, or Natural/ Physical Science
- 2 years of Social Science
- 4 years of additional core
- Any category above
- Foreign language
- Comparative religion or philosophy


## 16 Core-Courses

- Courses taken to graduate doesn't mean it automatically meets an approved core-course
- Courses needed/ taken to be admissible to a University doesn't automatically mean it meets an approved core-course
- Must be four-year college prep and above the high school's regular academic level (no remedial or slower paced classes)
- The high school has an ability to update approve core-courses with the Eligibility Center
- Your high school's core-course list can be viewed on the Resource page of the NCAA Eligibility Center website


## Nontraditional Courses

- Defined as those: taught via internet, distance learning, independent study, individualized instruction, correspondence, computer software programs or other similar means
- To meet a core-course requirement the following are examined:
- Ongoing access between instructor and student including interaction of teaching, evaluating, and providing assistance
- A defined period of time for completion
- Identified as a nontraditional class on the transcript
- Comparable in length, content, and rigor to the traditional setting course
- Credit recovery is also examined as above including the credit recovery policy
- Be sure to have the high school work with the Eligibility Center prior to taking these courses!


## Core-Course GPA

- Quality points= grade points multiplied by amount of credit
- $A=4$ points $B=3$ points $C=2$ points $D=1$ point
- B grade in $1^{\text {st }}$ semester English: 3 points $\times .50$ units $=1.5$ quality points
- Plus and minuses aren't used
- If a course is repeated the higher grade is used
- Please note some colleges don't accept Ds for admissions


## Students with Documented EducationImpacting Disabilities

- Same requirements need to be met, but the student may be provided accommodations to meet those requirements
- Division II: core-courses can used if completed at start of ninth-grade and until full time college enrollment
- Courses for students with disabilities can be used if on the approved corecourse list
- Take ACT or SAT with accommodations


## Division II Initial Eligibility- 2018

- After August 2018:
- Qualifier:
- 16 core courses
- Meet sliding scale of core-course GPA (minimum 2.2) and SAT/ ACT sum score
- Graduate high school
- Partial Qualifier:
- 16 core-courses
- Meet sliding scale of core-course GPA (minimum 2.0) and SAT/ ACT sum score
- Graduate high school
- Non-qualifier:
- Doesn't meet qualifier or partial qualifier requirements

## Amateurism Certification

- Required for Division I and II through the Eligibility Center
- Topics examined:
- Contracts with professional teams
- Salary for participating in athletics
- Prize money
- Play with professionals
- Tryouts, practice or competition with a professional team
- Benefits from an agent or prospective agent
- Agreement to be represented by an agent (now or in future)
- Participation in organized competition
- Financial assistance based on athletic skill or participation


## Organized Competition

- Delaying of full time college enrollment out of high school makes you subject to organized competition rule
- Division II has 1 year grace period
- Triggers after 1 year grace period (charged with a season in your sport for every calendar year of delayed enrollment):
- Competition scheduled in advance
- Official score kept
- Individual/ team standings or stats are maintained
- Official timer or game officials are used
- Admission is charged
- Teams regularly formed or rosters are predetermined
- Team uniforms are used


## Transfer Eligibility- 2 Year Transfer

- Graduate from the 2 year college provided you' ve attended for a minimum of 2 full time semesters
- $25 \%$ of credit used for degree must have been earned at the college that awards the degree
- 9 transferable units to the institution in last full time term
- Attend minimum of 2 full time semesters at the 2 year and:
- Have average of 12 transferable units per full time term
- 6 units of transferable English
- 3 units of transferable Math
- 3 units of transferable natural or physical science
- Limit of 2 PE activity courses (for unit and GPA requirement)
- 2.2 GPA
- 9 transferable units in last full time term


## 2 Year Transfer Eligibility

- Qualifier with no 4 year college attendance and one term at 2 year college
- One full time semester of attendance
- Average of 12 units per full time semester
- 2.2 GPA
- Limit of 2 PE activity units
- Exception: graduation after one semester (if previously attended a 4 year prior to the 2 year college)
- What if I don't meet these requirements?
- Qualifier- can practice and receive aid but not compete
- Partial Qualifier- can practice and receive aid but not compete
- Non-qualifier- must have unit/ subject requirements met and 2.0 to practice
