Santiago Charter Middle School Science Olympiad Team Presents at Nixon Library

ORANGE, Calif., March 21, 2011– For the second consecutive year, Santiago Middle School was invited to commemorate the Girl Scout's Birthday at the Richard Nixon Presidential Library.
