Preventing Bullying

During the month of October, Linda Vista Elementary School observed National Bullying Prevention Month. Bullying is defined as "unwanted, aggressive behavior among school-aged children that involves a real or perceived power imbalance. The Linda Vista community participated in a number of activities designed to increase awareness about bullying among students, parents, and staff. The first week, students and staff
