Type of School

Canyon High School opened in 1973. CHS serves approximately 2,400 students in grades 9-12. The academic program is organized on a rotating block schedule where students attend 3 block classes organized by even and odd days. Students are enrolled in 6 year-long courses. Students may enroll in a zero period class or 7th period class when available. Please note that 0-period or 7th period classes meet every day of the week. The block schedule permits an average of 100 minutes per period

Faculty

Canyon High School has a diverse staff who is highly collaborative and student centered. The administrative team consists of one principal and three assistant principals. Additional support is provided by two athletic directors and one ASB director.

School Community

Canyon High School is nestled on a forty-acre campus in the Anaheim Hills community. Anaheim Hills is an upper middle socio-economic community located off the 91 Freeway with close proximity to Los Angeles and Riverside counties. The diversity of CHS is 57% White, 2% African American, 2.5% Native American, 20% Asian, 3.4% Pacific Islander/Other, and 15% Hispanic.

In May 2015, 703 students took AP exams. A total of 1,436 exams were taken in 19 subjects. 69.4% of the AP exams received a score of 3 or higher.

Canyon's AP program is a three-year program designed to give students the rigor of college in a high school setting. These offerings directly connect a student to what they want to

do now and with their future.

In May 2015, 85 IB exams were taken in 10 subjects. 9 out of 10 candidates received IB Diplomas. 87% of the IB exams received a score of 4 or higher.

The IB program is a two year program. A Diploma candidate is required to take six IB courses and six exams, a Theory of Knowledge course, the Extended Essay, and Action and Service hours.

Canyon High School is committed to graduating students who are ready for the next steps toward college and career. 40% of the courses are articulated with higher education. In the 2014-2015 School year there were a total of 920 students enrolled in CTE classes. 100% of the students who completed a CTE Pathway earned a high school diploma.

In a CTE pathway, students take rigorous academic courses and participate in work-based learning opportunities including: mentoring with industry professionals, job shadowing, and professional internships. After successful completion of a CTE program, students can graduate from high school with industry certification or college credit.
